In this presentation, Professor Yu Xie first highlights a significant increase in economic inequality in contemporary utilizing various China by sources. He then presents results from his research program on the significant impact of rising economic inequality on a variety of social and demographic outcomes in China: intergenerational mobility, marriage age, marriage partner choice, fertility, and mortality. Professor Xie shows that across a variety of social and demographic outcomes. heightened levels of economic inequality in today's China have negative consequences from lowering mobility, making social marriage difficult, to reducing fertility and life expectancy.
