

Sample Communications and New Media Study Plans for Cohort 2018-2020

These study plans assume you are a Communications and New Media (CNM) Single Major Honours or CNM Single Major. While you can read any CNM module as long as you meet the pre-requisites, the logical path is to complete NM1101E and the introductory theories (NM2101) and methods (NM2103, NM2104) modules early on. After obtaining a broad overview of the major domains and methods of the discipline from the compulsory modules, you can move on to the electives – more specialised content and empirical modules. For honours students, the level 4000 modules would generally be completed in the final year, although it's possible to take these modules in Year 3 Sem 2 if the pre-requisites are met (all Honours modules require 80 MCs to have been completed before taking them).

Please note that the focus of this document is on the CNM requirements. Majoring in Communications and New Media

- NM1101E should ideally be read in your first year, as shown in Table 1A. However, these modules are always in great demand, but there is no need to panic if you aren't able to read both in your first year. Table 2A shows that even if you can only complete them in your third semester, you can still fulfil the CNM requirements comfortably.
- The compulsory methods modules NM2103 and NM2104 should ideally be read in your second year, as an understanding of research methods will help you better understand some of the research discussed in elective NM modules.
- Your final year should generally be reserved for your level 4000 electives, and the optional Honours Thesis.

Single Major [B.A.]

To graduate with a single major [B.A.] in NM, students need to:

- 1. Pass NM1101E or NM1101X. This will be counted towards the Faculty Core or UE requirements.
- 2. Pass at least **44 MCs** of NM modules or NM-recognised modules which includes the following:
 - a. NM2101
 - b. NM2103
 - c. NM2104
 - d. NM3550Y (see note 1 below)
 - e. A minimum of **20 MCs** from level-3000 modules or higher (inclusive of NM3550Y).
 - f. A maximum of 2 level-4000 NM modules.
 - g. A maximum of 8 MCs of NM-recognised modules.

Notes:

- i. Students may read TR3202 (12 MCs) in place of NM3550Y.
- ii. Level-5000 or NM modules are not allowed.

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iii. NM3550Y is only compulsory for FASS students. Non-FASS students must read other level-3000 or higher NM or NM-recognised modules in lieu of MN3550Y.

Single Major [B.Soc.Sci.(Hons)]

To graduate with a single major [B.Soc.Sci.(Hons)] in NM, students need to:

- 1. Pass NM1101E or NM1101X. This will be counted towards the Faculty Core or UE requirements.
- 2. Pass at least **84 MCs** of NM or NM-recognised modules, which include the following:
 - a. NM2101
 - b. NM2103
 - c. NM2104
 - d. NM3550Y (see note 1 below)
 - e. NM4102 (no longer compulsory for Cohort 2017 onwards, except for students doing Honours Thesis)
 - f. A minimum of **20 MCs** of level-3000 NM or NM-recognised modules or higher (inclusive of NM3550Y), with
 - g. A minimum of **40 MCs** from level-4000 or higher, with NM4102 compulsory for those from Cohort 2016 and before.
 - h. A maximum of 2 level-5000 NM modules (subject to department's approval).
 - i. A maximum of 12 MCs of NM-recognised modules.

Notes:

- i. Students may read TR3202 (12 MCs) in place of NM3550Y.
- ii. NM3550Y is only compulsory for FASS students. Non-FASS students must read other level-3000 or higher NM or NM-recognised modules in lieu of MN3550Y.
- iii. Level-5000 modules subject to department's approval.

Please see below for a sample study plan for a CNM Honours major. Do note that this is just an example, and there are many other orders you can take the modules in. We do recommend that you complete your compulsory core modules by your second year.

If you do not intend to take Honours, you can just ignore the Year 4 section of the table.

Students who are doing the year-long Honours Thesis (HT) will be allocated the HT at the during the semester that they are starting on the HT. Even though the allocation takes place one semester earlier, the HT will still only count for a total of 15 MCs.

This table shows the student taking the Compulsory Internship Programme or CIP (NM3550Y) in Year 3 Sem 2. Note that it could also be taken in Year 3 Sem 1.

While students read 20 MCs in a 'typical' semester, students are encouraged not to read modules in the semester they are undergoing their 12 MCs Compulsory Internship Programme (NM3550Y) due to the amount of work involved. This means that you would instead make up for the missing 8 MCs by 'overloading' in two other semesters, e.g. Year 2 Sem 2 and Year 3 Sem 1 in the sample plan above. While discouraged, it is still possible to read a module during CIP. Modules which end in a Y suffix such as NM3234Y and NM3239Y are designed to be compatible with CIP in terms of their scheduling.

The table also depicts a student reading Honours Thesis who takes 4 level 4000 elective modules in Year 4 Sem 1, and 1 level 4000 elective module in Year 4 Sem 2, leaving a lot of time in Sem 2 to focus on writing the thesis. As a significant amount of preparation work for the thesis may need to be done in Sem 1, you may want to instead complete 3 level 4000 modules in Sem 1, and 2 level 4000 modules in Sem 2. An Independent Study Module (ISM) could be taken as a level 4000 elective, though this can only be done by students who will not be pursuing an Honours Thesis.

Second Major in Communications and New Media

Graduation Requirements for Cohorts 2019 and 2020

To graduate with a second major in NM, students need to:

- 1. Pass NM1101E or NM1101X. This will be counted towards the Faculty Core or UE requirements.
- 2. Pass at least **36 MCs** of NM modules or NM-recognised modules which includes the following:
 - a. NM2101
 - b. NM2103
 - c. NM2104
 - d. A minimum of 16 MCs from Level 3000.

Notes:

- i. NM3550Y is only compulsory for CNM primary majors. Students who are on NUS Overseas College (NOC) may read TR3202 in lieu of NM3550Y.
- ii. Level-5000 or NM modules are not allowed.

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Graduation Requirements for Cohorts 2016 - 2018

To graduate with a second major in NM, students need to:

- 1. Pass NM1101E or NM1101X. This will be counted towards the Faculty Core or UE requirements.
- 2. Pass at least 44 MCs of NM modules or NM-recognised modules which includes the following:
 - a. NM2101
 - b. NM2103
 - c. NM2104
 - d. NM3550Y (see notes 1 and 2 below)
 - e. A minimum of 20 MCs from level-3000 modules or higher (inclusive of NM3550Y).
 - f. A maximum of 2 level-4000 NM modules.
 - g. A maximum of 8 MCs NM-recognised modules.

Notes:

- i. NM3550Y is only compulsory for FASS students. Non-FASS students must read other level-3000 or higher NM or NM-recognised modules in lieu of NM3550Y.
- ii. FASS students may read TR3202 (12 MCs) in place of NM3550Y.
- iii. Level-5000 or NM modules are not allowed.

^{*} fulfils FASS Social Sciences exposure requirement; Faculty Core 5. This is only the case if the primary major is not a Social Sciences exposure module. If that is the case, then the primary major exposure module would fulfil the FASS Social Sciences exposure requirement, and NM1101E would be a UE.

Note: Up to 16 MCs of second major modules can be double counted with the Faculty/Primary Major/Minor modules. This would free up some Unrestricted Elective spaces. The sample table above assumes no double counting, meaning that all the UE spaces are taken up by 2nd major modules.

[#] Students who are doing the year-long Honours Thesis (HT) will be allocated the HT at the during the semester that they are starting on the HT. Even though the allocation takes place one semester earlier, the HT will still only count for a total of 15 MCs.

Minoring in Communications and New Media

The Minor in Communications and New Media (CNM) is targeted at students who are already majoring in another programme, but are interested in acquiring an exposure to Communication and Media Studies.

The ModReg system prioritises majors, so you may have difficulty getting into the core modules. The recommended approach is to read one module per semester, as shown in Table 3A, but if you cannot get in, it is still possible to complete the minor if you read two per semester from your fourth semester onwards, as shown in Table 3B.

Graduation Requirements for Cohorts 2019 onwards

To graduate with a Minor in Communications and New Media, students need to pass at least **20 MCs** of NM modules, which include:

- 1. NM1101E or NM1101X. This will be counted towards Faculty Core or UE requirements.
- 2. Pass at least **16 MCs** of NM modules, which include the following:
 - a. NM2101
 - b. An additional **12 MCs** of NM-coded modules, of which a minimum of **4 MCs** are from Level 3000 or higher.

Graduation Requirements for Cohorts 2018 and earlier

To graduate with a Minor in Communications and New Media, students need to pass at least **24 MCs** of NM modules, which include:

- 1. NM1101E or NM1101X. This will be counted towards Faculty Core or UE requirements.
- 2. Pass at least **20 MCs** of NM modules, which include the following:
 - a. NM2101
 - b. An additional **16 MCs** of NM-coded modules, of which a minimum of **8 MCs** are from Level 3000 or higher.

Note: the suggested plans below are for Cohort 2019 onwards. Students from earlier cohorts would read one additional elective.

Minoring in Cultural Studies

The Minor in Cultural Studies is a very unique programme that allows you to pick and mix modules across various disciplines. Cultural Studies is an interdisciplinary field focused on the interpretation and understanding of cultural forms and practices, including cinema, cyberspace, social media, popular fiction, popular music, television, and popular art. Students who take up this minor will leave it with knowledge of contemporary debates in cultural studies and with a theoretical tool-kit capable of analysing a range of social processes that give rise to and underpin the cultural forms and practices.

Graduation Requirements for Cohorts 2019 onwards

To graduate with the Minor in Cultural Studies, students must pass a minimum of **20 MCs** of recognised Cultural Studies Minor modules, which must include:

- 1. NM3241 Cultural Studies: Theory and Practice
- 2. Four elective modules (16 MCs)

Notes:

- i. A minimum of **8 MCs** at Level-3000 (including NM3241)
- ii. Students are limited to taking a maximum of two modules (including NM3241) from the same department (outside student's major)

Graduation Requirements for Cohorts 2018 onwards

To graduate with the Minor in Cultural Studies, students must pass a minimum of 24 MCs of recognised Cultural Studies Minor modules, which must include:

- 1. NM3241 Cultural Studies: Theory and Practice
- 2. Five elective modules (20 MCs)

Notes:

- i. A minimum of **8 MCs** at Level-2000
- ii. A minimum of **8 MCs** at Level-3000 (including NM3241)
- iii. Students are limited to taking a maximum of two modules (including NM3241) from the same department (outside student's major)
- iv. The list of recognised electives can be found here: https://fass.nus.edu.sg/cnm/undergraduate-minor-cultural-studies/

Students can refer to the suggested plans in the 'Minoring in Communications and New Media' above but replace the NM modules with Cultural Studies modules. Note that the compulsory module NM3241 Cultural Studies: Theory and Practice does not have to be read before the elective modules.

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You may also email the academic convenor Professor Audrey Yue (<u>audrey.yue@nus.edu.sg</u>) to recognise FASS modules not in this list or modules taken during exchange programmes at other universities for the minor.

Graduation Requirements for Cohorts 2019 onwards

- Complete 20 MCs of modules from the following NM and CS module lists below, of which at least 12 MCs must be taken from outside the full set of modules which make up the student's primary major.
- 2. **Up to 8 MCs** of modules may be used to satisfy both major and minor requirements. Students must take modules from both the NM and CS module lists, with **at least 8 MCs** from the **NM** list and **at least 8 MCs** from the **CS** List.
- 3. For non-CS students, please note that NM2207 is acceptable as a prerequisite for CS3240. However, also note that CS1010 is a preclusion for NM2207, so students planning to take NM2207 should do so before taking CS1010.

Graduation Requirements for Cohorts 2018 onwards

- Complete 24 MCs of modules from the following NM and CS module lists below, of which at least 12 MCs must be taken from outside the full set of modules which make up the student's primary major.
- 2. **Up to 8 MCs** of modules may be used to satisfy both major and minor requirements. Students must take modules from both the NM and CS module lists, with **at least 8 MCs** from the **NM** list and **at least 8 MCs** from the **CS** List.
- 3. For non-CS students, please note that NM2207 is acceptable as a prerequisite for CS3240. However, also note that CS1010 is a preclusion for NM2207, so students planning to take NM2207 should do so before taking CS1010.
