MMM4 TRAVEL AWARD FOR DEVELOPING NATION EARLY CAREER RESEARCHERS

- Conference registration fee (estimated at subsidized rate of US\$350)
- Accommodation (shared dormitory accommodation booked through the conference coordinators, estimated at US\$360 for 6 nights)
- Mentorship from a member of the Scientific Committee during the conference and for the development of a follow-up publication

Eligibility criteria

- · You are currently studying for a PhD, or you gained your PhD after July 2011.
- You are from a tropical developing nation as defined by the World Bank (see below).
- You have an abstract of sufficient quality to be approved by the Scientific Committee.
- Your study fits the mandate of the Singapore Journal of Tropical Geography (physical geography, human geography, human-environment interactions, and environmental science). See http://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/journal/10.1111/(ISSN)1467-9493.
- You will be presenting a study that can be submitted for publication to the Singapore
 Journal of Tropical Geography by December 2016.

Application Procedure

- A 1-page abstract, written and formatted as described on the conference website:

- A CV (2 pages maximum) describing educational history, previous experience, previous conferences attended, and publications
- A 1-page justification document describing why you wish to attend this conference, the current stage of the research you will be presenting, and how attending this conference will improve your research and career
- A list of estimated travel expenses

Applications will be judged on the suitability of the research to SJTG, financial need, and the justification of how attending this conference will contribute to the future career of the researcher.
