 Where: Bali Barat National Park, Bali, Indonesia (about 5-6 hours drive from Denpasar Airport)

• When: 10 - 17 Dec 2015

Key Highlights

- a) Involvement in community-based conservation in Indonesia (eg. coral reef transects, installing irrigation systems to extend farming seasons)
- Application of textbook ecology knowledge to real-world challenges (eg. identification of invasive species, observation of food chains in action, observing the impact of climate change on fragile ecosystems)
- c) Interaction with Director of Agriculture and Forestry for Biosphere Foundation, Ms Sally Silverstone, who has been actively engaged in agricultural, environmental and closed-system research and development projects for the past 30 years. (She was one of only eight researchers as well as the Co-Captain and Food Systems Manager for the two-year Biosphere 2 experiment, the world's largest materially enclosed ecosystem)
- Estimated programme cost (including airfare, accommodation, pre-trip training):
 \$\$1,845 per student
- Estimated cost of one participating NUS staff: S\$1,590 (subsidised rate)
