Admissions Requirements



There are two ways to enter the programme:

Students may indicate their desire to enter the programme when applying to NUS on the NUS Admissions Portal. If shortlisted, they will be invited to submit an essay and video. Applicants will be selected on the basis of their 'A' level/IB/High School qualifications and submitted application material.

Students may also indicate their desire to enter the programme after the first year of study in NUS by declaring PPE-XDP as a major. You will need to attain a GPA of at least 4.0, with at least 28 units in graded modules, and score at least an average of A- (with no grade lower than a B+) for the exposure modules of Philosophy (GEX1015), Political Science (PS1101E), and Economics (ECH101E).

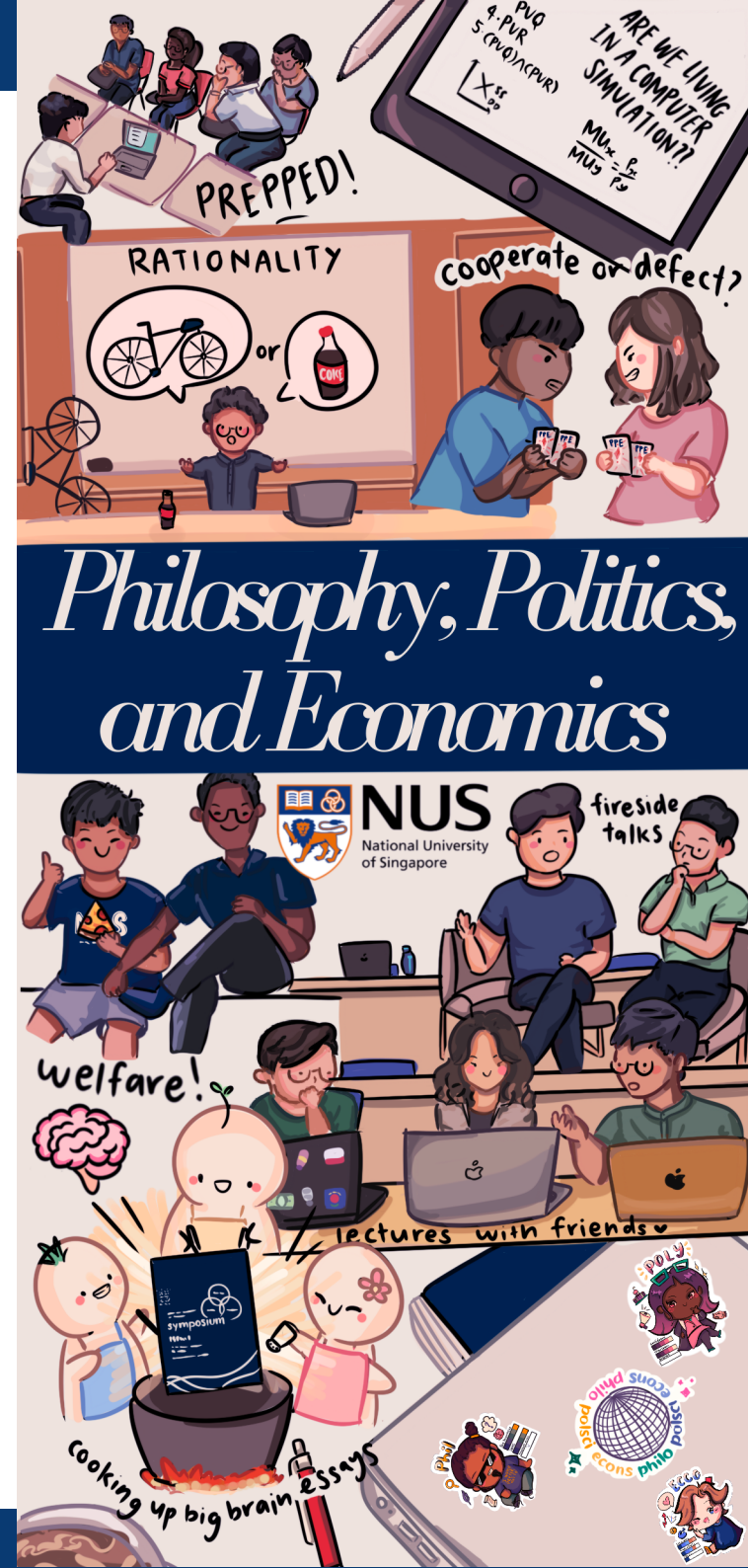

Curriculum Structure



Deep dive into the three well-established disciplines:

Philosophy (PH) courses

Hone your analytical thinking and logical skills through engaging with thought-provoking texts, participating in lively discussions on profound questions, and learning the art of argumentation.

Political Science (PS) courses

Explore how political institutions shape the society we live in and understand the forces that sustain or challenge these systems. Courses range across four subfields: Comparative Politics, International Relations, Political Theory, and Governance and Public Policy.

Economics (EC) courses

Learn about decision-making frameworks that shape how precious resources are allocated. This critical knowledge lays the foundation for understanding policy-making, and behaviour that drives major economic events and phenomena.

Interdisciplinary (PE) Courses

These are specially designed classes which bring PPE students together. You get to learn how to utilise insights and methods from across the three fields to dissect and approach complex problems that impact society.

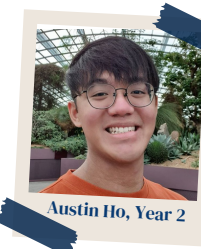
