ABOUT THE COURSE

Child Centered Play Therapy (CCPT) is a specialized approach in play therapy for working therapeutically with children, ages 3 to 12, who are experiencing behavioral or emotional difficulties. CCPT is a humanistic therapy based on the principles that play is the language of children, that growth and healing develops from fully and completely accepting the child exactly for he or she is, and that safety and structure are essential ingredients.

This course will cover the foundation and principles of CCPT, teach the specialized tracking techniques of CCPT, increase understanding of play themes; including maladjusted and trauma play, and teach ways to assess progress in therapy. Course will include case study and experiential skill practice.

At the end of the workshop, participants will be able to:

1. Apply the eight principles of CCPT (as developed by Virginia Axline)
2. Assess the suitability of CCPT with different client base
3. Utilize the various types of skills and responses of CCPT such as reflecting feelings, increasing self concept, facilitate decision making and returning responsibilities to child
4. Track the child's behavioral, emotional and play themes in therapy
5. Set limits and boundaries for challenging behaviors in the therapy room

PRE-REQUISITE:

Attended a prior workshop on Introduction to Play Therapy or any other play modalities such as Gestalt or Traumaplay or the equivalent.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This course is targeted at Social Workers and all helping professionals who work with children and youths to improve their social integration, growth and development, emotional modulation and trauma resolution.

ABOUT THE TRAINER



Dr. Alicia Pon has been a child psychotherapist and social worker for over 20 years. Her professional training is in General Psychology, Child and Adolescent Mental Health, Play Therapy, Sandplay Therapy, Somatic Experiencing®, Grief Counseling and Social Work. For the last 16 years, Dr. Pon was based in Hong Kong, and worked and managed her private practice at full capacity. Her clinical experiences and specializations include divorce & separation, grief & loss, complex trauma, adoption & attachment, developmental stresses, and parent-child relationship. Dr. Pon was on staff and served as an Honorary Assistant Professor with the University of Hong Kong and Hong Kong

Shue Yan University. She lectured and supervised undergraduate and post graduate students in the areas of counseling and psychotherapy, grief and loss, child and adolescent mental health, play therapy and social work. At present, Dr. Pon serves as a Senior Lecturer with National University of Singapore. In addition, Dr. Pon has been involved in the research on Somatic Work, Psycho-oncology, Play Therapy and End of Life in the University department.
