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ABOUT THE COURSE:

The practice of social work involves ethical decision making. When dealing with an ethical conflict, social workers must determine which ethical principles take precedence, as well as consider client's values, institutional policies and legislations. The profession's Code of Ethics provides guidance in various situations but is not designed for complex ethical situations. Instead, social workers must rely on ethical reasoning. This didactic and interactive course emphasizes ethical reasoning as a cornerstone in social work ethical decision-making. It aims to equip social workers with the theoretical foundation of ethics, ways of ethical reasoning and decision-making to arrive at an ethically defensible course of action.

At the end of the workshop, participants are expected to be able to do the following:

1. Describe key ethical theories.
2. Explain ethical principles and values.
3. Determine the ethical principles that apply in an ethical conflict.
4. Apply the methods in ethical decision-making.
