ABOUT THE COURSE:

We all begin and are shaped by family experiences, whether it be in an active or passive and positive or negative manner. Participants in this two-day module will be helped to appreciate and work with families of offenders to work toward rehabilitation. Oftentimes, this means the families too must undergo its own change and development.

The learning objectives are:

1. Identify how the structure of the family may have contributed to and may be impacted by the addiction and anti-social behaviour of the clients.
2. Identify how family processes may have contributed to the addict's behaviour and how changes to it can be supportive of rehabilitation and reintegration.
3. Enhance family's resilience in the face of multiple stressors brought by the addiction.
4. List Models of Family Therapy that may be best suited to support rehabilitation and reintegration of the family.
