ABOUT THE COURSE:

The goal of this workshop is to equip participants with knowledge necessary for working alongside clients with schizophrenia spectrum disorder.

The learning objectives are as follows:

1. Identify the signs and symptoms of schizophrenia; namely, hallucinations, delusions, disorganized thinking, grossly disorganized or abnormal motor behavior, and negative symptoms)
2. Recognize other important features of the disorder that include cognitive deficits and unawareness of illness
3. Differentiate between schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder, and schizophreniform disorder
4. Assess for comorbid conditions in schizophrenia
5. Describe the pharmacotherapy of schizophrenia
6. Choose between evidence-based psychosocial therapies
7. Contrasting between clinical recovery and personal recovery
8. Developing strategies that promote hope and recovery in schizophrenia

ABOUT THE TRAINER:



Caroline is an Assistant Professor in social work at NUS. She completed her master's degree in social work at Columbia University and then received her PhD from the University of Southern California. Caroline's research commitment centers on arriving at an enhanced understanding of the heterogeneous treatment outcomes in schizophrenia from an ecological perspective. Prior to pursuing her doctorate in social work, Caroline spent 5 years as a psychiatric social worker at the Institute of Mental Health (IMH) in Singapore. In this position, her primary responsibility involved overseeing the care of individuals referred for treatment of a first psychotic episode, of

whom the majority was diagnosed with schizophrenia. She formulated, implemented, and monitored individualized psychiatric treatment services in consultation with a multidisciplinary team of mental health practitioners to meet the evolving needs of patients and their caregivers. She was also charged with conducting clinical assessments to identify individuals at clinical high-risk of psychosis for preventive interventions. During her tenure at IMH, she managed the care of more than 200 patients. Her professional experience has equipped her with an intimate knowledge of the diagnosis, course, and treatment of schizophrenia and other serious psychiatric disorders occurring in adults. She has also acquired sound knowledge of mental health laws and the mechanics of mental health treatment delivery in Singapore.
