Our 2nd Singapore Social Work Practice Research Conference 2021 had passed by successfully. We appreciate the participation of everyone who were able to attend. The keynote address by Professor Bowen McBeath was enlightening in examining the wider ecology in which practice research takes place. Other segments such as the learning journeys of our existing 5 LCG research teams, thoughtfully moderated by Associate Professor Timothy Sim, gave us encouraging insights into the value of research on practice. The conference ended with a panel of speakers from UK, Denmark and Singapore on the impact of the global pandemic on social work practice and practice research in the context of the new social environment in different parts of the world. This fits in with one of the goals of the Mrs Lee Choon Guan Endowed Research Fund, which is to help practitioners understand and develop familiarity with practice research so that eventually it can become part and parcel of professional social work practice for the eventual benefit of service users. We will send a note on the event once the date is finalized.
- Professor Ian Shaw, who was mentioned at the conference as an important contributor to quality practice research by one of the research teams, will also be providing consultation to individuals/teams who are interested in preparing a grant proposal and wants to bounce ideas with someone whose forte is in conceptualizing and conducting research from different perspectives. We will be arranging consultation sessions with Professor Shaw and look forward to you contacting the Secretariat (<a href="mailto:swk\_LCGResFund@nus.edu.sg">swk\_LCGResFund@nus.edu.sg</a>) to indicate your wish to be included. Mutually convenient consultation sessions can then be arranged starting from October to the last week of December 2021.
