## About the Course

The practice of social work involves ethical decision making. When dealing with an ethical conflict, social workers must determine which ethical principles take precedence, as well as consider client's values, institutional policies and legislations. The profession's Code of Ethics provides guidance for certain contexts but is not designed for complex ethical situations. Instead, social workers must rely on ethical reasoning.

This didactic and interactive course emphasizes ethical reasoning as a cornerstone in social work ethical decision-making. It introduces participants to the theoretical foundation of ethics, and elucidates ethical principles, ethical reasoning and decision-making to arrive at an ethically defensible course of action. Through the use of genuine cases, participants will discern when their personal values interfere with ethical decision-making, and appreciate the tension contemporaneous with ethical dilemmas.

## At the end of the course, participants will be able to:

1. Describe key ethical theories.
2. Explain ethical principles and values.
3. Determine the ethical principles that apply in an ethical conflict.
4. Apply the methods in ethical decision-making.
