# A Critical Review of Mental Health Diagnosis, Treatment, and Social Work Practice

## About the Course

Social work in mental health care requires that social work professionals develop a critical and reflexive position, understanding the context in which mental disorder is placed, and the bidirectional influences of socio-political factors on persons with mental illness and their families. Setting the context for care is critical for social work intervention to facilitate the recovery journey of our clients and their family caregivers.

This module provides an evolutionary coverage of mental health treatment; and how social work contributes to the recovery model today. It also provides a critical perspective into mental health diagnosis and classification, the role of mental health screening tools, legislations governing the care and treatment of persons, and related ethical issues in social work practice.

- Understand the context in which mental illness is placed and the evolution of treatment and care concepts.
- Develop an understanding of mental health classification and diagnoses.
- Apply relevant mental health legislation and related legislation in social work interventions with persons with mental health condition.
- Understand the domains of mental state screening with persons with mental health condition
- Apply the Integrated Illness Causation Model and systemic framework in the assessment of mental illness
- Appreciate the roles of social workers in mental health social work

## Who Should Attend

Social workers, case managers and community-based counsellors in the medical and social sectors who:

1. Have at least 3 years of experience working with clients with common mental health conditions;
2. Preferably, have attended basic mental health education at the undergraduate level, mental health first aid training, or the Foundational Module in Mental Health with the NUS Department of SWK, etc.
