Student Exchange Programme (Cohort 2016 onwards)

With effect from the admission cohort of AY2016/2017, students admitted into an undergraduate degree under the modular system in NUS and who take longer than the <u>normal candidature period</u> to complete their degree requirements will have to pay partial non-subsidized fees, culminating in full non-subsidized fees, during the extended semesters. *Tuition fees charged for these extended semesters will need to be paid in cash. Fees cannot be paid by CPF.*

The fees payable beyond normal candidature period are summarised in the following table:
