Tentative Course Description

This course focuses on the complex interactions and relationships between the economy, society and government. With the economy as a fundamental entity, students will learn about key economic concepts to analyse government policies and the ensuing impact on society; how market failures emerge and the need for adroit government intervention including effective education and tax policies; and how societal changes steer policymaking to tackle issues such as equity-efficiency tradeoffs. The module will introduce students to ideas of top thinkers in the field of political economy, such as Adam Smith, John Maynard Keynes and Max Weber.
