### **Tentative Course Description**

This course explores Singapore's economic transformation and its relationships with major partners in Asia and beyond. It examines how globalisation, regional integration, and technological change have shaped Singapore's development strategies and economic resilience. Students will learn about the economies of Singapore's key partners and gain analytical skills to evaluate Singapore's approaches to trade, finance, labour, and innovation policies within a regional and global context. By the end of the course, students will understand how Singapore manages interdependence, competition, and collaboration with key partners to sustain its competitiveness in a rapidly evolving global economy.
