<p><b>Admission Requirements</b></p>	<p><b><u>Interested Semester Exchange Applicant should:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be an <b>undergraduate student</b>;</li> <li>• Be nominated by your home university;</li> <li>• Have completed <b>at least</b> 1 semester of undergraduate studies before enrolment at SUSS and must <b>continue to be registered</b> at your home university throughout your exchange at SUSS;</li> <li>• Not be in your final year of study at your home university while on exchange at SUSS.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Academic Requirements</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minimum GPA requirement of 3.3 over a 5-point scale;</li> <li>• Students nominated for the Semester Exchange should ensure that they have the <b>proficiency in English</b> to understand and follow the pace of lessons.</li> <li>• Certain courses have pre-requisites. SUSS will contact students for relevant supporting documents if required.</li> </ul>

<p><b>Workload per Semester &amp; Courses Selection</b></p>	<p>At SUSS, full-time undergraduates usually take 3 to 6 courses per semester (15-30 Credit Units [CUs]), with each course typically allocated 5 CUs.</p> <p>Inbound students on PARTIAL SUSEP must <b>select</b> at least 3 to 6 courses in SUSS during the application period.</p> <p>Inbound students who have accepted the PARTIAL SUSEP must be <b>enrolled in at least 1 course in SUSS</b> during the semester to remain in the programme.</p>

<p><b>Course registration and Course Load Requirements</b></p>	<p>Nominated students will receive an email from the Global Learning team with a link to an online Application Form via email.</p> <p>Students are encouraged to <b>select</b> at least 6 courses for a partial SEP, or up to a maximum of 15 courses for a full SEP, via the online Application form.</p> <p>As a Local Student (Singapore Citizen &amp; Singapore PR)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You must be enrolled in at least <b>1 SUSS course (5 Credit Units)</b> for the semester.</li> <li>• The maximum course load allowed is <b>6 courses (30 Credit Units)</b> per semester.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Course Registration during application period</b></p>	<p>Students may select up to 15 courses as part of their application (Note: All students must select at least 3 - 6 courses), in case of any timetable or examination clashes. Courses are to be ranked according to priority. Changes to course selection are permissible on a case-to-case basis after the submission of the application form.</p> <p>As students are not guaranteed places for any course, it is recommended that you select the maximum number of courses according to priority to ensure that you are allocated the minimum number of courses (15 CU).</p> <p>Note: There is a possibility where courses that are granted approval during the application period do not run during the semester due to low sign-ups or any other reason. Do ensure course planning is prepared with consideration.</p>

<p><b>Course Restrictions</b></p>	<p>Please refer to the exclusion list for course restrictions attached.</p> <p>Kindly note that this exclusion list will be updated as and when required. The latest copy, if any, will be sent promptly to partner universities.</p> <p>All exchange students are only permitted to attend courses designed for undergraduates.</p> <p>The course codes should fall within the range of 100-400 (for example FIN205, BUS362 and FIN415), <b>not</b> including courses within the exclusion list.</p>
<p><b>Credit Transfer</b></p>	<p>It is the student's responsibility to ensure that the SUSS courses selected are transferable for credits at their home university. To find course outlines, students can make use of the <a href="#">SUSS CourseFinder</a>.</p>
<p><b>Language of Instruction</b></p>	<p>English is the main medium of instruction in SUSS, with the exclusion of Language and/or language-related courses that are conducted via non-English languages.</p> <p><b><i>*Majority of the classes are conducted in English.</i></b></p>
<p><b>Accommodation</b></p>	<p>SUSS does not offer on/off-campus accommodation.</p>
<p><b>Orientation Programme</b></p>	<p>Orientation day typically takes place on the weekend (Saturday) prior to the start of semester.</p> <p>The Global Learning team will send an email to notify all inbound students to join the event. All inbound students are welcome to campus for the orientation prior to commencement of the semester.</p>
<p><b>Student Insurance</b></p>	<p>Exchange students are required to be covered by a compulsory health insurance plan with their home university. SUSS does not provide insurance coverage for visiting students.</p>


<b>Tuition Fees</b>	<p><b>This is a fee-waiver exchange programme.</b></p> <p>In accordance with the student exchange agreement with our partner universities, exchange students are <b>not</b> required to pay tuition fees to SUSS. However, other administrative fees are applicable i.e. SUSS Miscellaneous fees, additional fees for course materials, etc.</p> <p><b>Other Fees</b> You will be subject to a nominal administration fee of \$100.00 (there will be an additional 9% GST at point of billing) if you wish to withdraw from a course <b>more than two weeks after the semester commences</b>, or after enrolment in a course is completed (whichever is earlier).</p> <p><b>Refund Policy</b> If a written notice of withdrawal is given within the cooling off period<sup>#</sup>, a full refund of the fees paid will be given. No refund will be given for withdrawal thereafter.</p> <p><i><sup>#</sup>The cooling off period is defined as 7 working days after payment of the fees to the University.</i></p>



#### Method 1: Using CourseFinder


1. Apply the filter under **Course Type: Modular Undergraduate Course**



2. Ensure the filter is applied **before searching** for course outlines.



3. Set the filter to **“Undergraduate Modular Courses”** to view courses available for **inbound semester exchange students**. Enter the course code or course title in the Search field.




## Method 2: Direct Link to Course Outline

If you prefer a **PDF copy** of the course outline:

1. Scroll to the **bottom of the course page**.
2. Click **“Full-time Programmes”** or **“Part-Time Programmes / CET Courses”** to download the PDF.

## Fact Sheet on Course Registration Restrictions for Inbound Students on Student Semester Exchange

### Important Course Registration Restrictions for all inbound students

*Note: All applicants for SUSS Inbound Semester Exchange must be matriculated students at their respective home universities or institutes.*

1. SUSS' courses are coded in the following convention: Course Abbreviation + Digit for Course Level + Assigned Course number. The first digit in the course code denotes the level of the course. For example, BUS103 indicates a Level 1 Business course.

*Note that:*

- **Courses coded with 10X – 40X** are *undergraduate courses*.
- **Courses coded with 50X and above** are *graduate courses*.

2. All post-graduate courses under the Graduate Studies programmes (**Graduate Diploma, Master and Doctor programmes**) are **NOT** open to inbound students on Semester Exchange. Course codes under these programmes typically range from Level 50X to Level 60X, with a small handful of Level 40X courses falling under the Master programmes.

3. **ALL** courses from the School of Law are **NOT** open to inbound students on Semester Exchange.

- Graduate Diploma in Taxation: Courses are prefixed with "TAX"
- Master of Taxation: Courses are prefixed with "TAX"
- Bachelor of Law: Courses are prefixed with "LAW"
- Juris Doctor: Courses are prefixed with "LAW"

4. All courses from the following Undergraduate study programmes are **NOT** open to inbound students on Semester Exchange:

- a. Bachelor of Early Childhood Education (with Minor): Courses are prefixed with "ECE"  
*Note: This is applicable to BOTH [Full-Time](#) and [Part-Time](#) Early Childhood Education programmes.*
- b. [Bachelor of Early Childhood and Chinese Language Education](#) (学前华文教育学士学位)  
*Note: Courses are prefixed with "ECC" and "ECL"*
- c. [Bachelor of Social Work \(Full-Time\)](#): Courses are prefixed with "SWK"  
*Note: This is applicable to BOTH [Full-Time](#) and [Part-Time](#) Social Work programmes.*
- d. [BA Tamil Language and Literature](#): Courses are prefixed with "TLL"

5. Requests for any courses not listed in the course offerings and/or course mentioned in this document will **NOT** be granted as they are not available for the semester exchange programme. All appeals for approval will **NOT** be entertained.

Note: Some courses offered at point of course selection period may not be available towards the course confirmation period due to low enrollment rates.

6. Request for LAB-based courses are **subject to the approval**. SUSS reserves the right to review and/or reject any requests for courses that involve lab sessions. All appeals for approval will **NOT** be entertained.

7. All Undergraduate courses with course codes prefixed with:

- “NCO”,
- “NIE”,
- “CDO”,
- “ETB”,
- “SDE”,
- “ECE”/“ECL”/“ECC”, and
- “SWK”.

Are not listed in the course offering and strictly **NOT** open to inbound students.

8. The following courses are **NOT** included in the course offering as they are **NOT** open to inbound students.

- ANL321;
- BUS490;
- MKT498;
- MKT499;
- NIE499;
- BIS388;
- COU-coded courses;
- All courses that involve international travelling;
- HBC105;
- HBC215;
- LOG223; and
- VIS251

9. Approval for courses prefixed with “FMT” will be considered on case-by-case basis only if applicants have prior knowledge or background in buildings and/or building services that meet the pre-requisites of the FMT- courses. SUSS reserves the right to decline students’ course requests.

10. Courses with pre-requisites may or may not be open to inbound students, hence interested applicants who decide to apply for such courses should have the supporting documents ready to verify their eligibility for the course.

In addition, inbound students should understand that they may not eventually be successful in their request for a particular course or courses even if they are able to produce proof of fulfilment of pre-requisites.

11. External courses that come with additional costs and/or are not conducted within SUSS premises are **NOT** offered to inbound students.
12. Students who wish to take [MLL181 Malay Language for Work 1](#) should have basic background knowledge of the Malay language, for example, proficient enough to be able to maintain a (daily) conversation.

Note: Students should **NOT** hold formal qualifications like the “A” and/or “O” Levels Certificate for Malay language.
